


LONG EXPOSURE photo contest


BLUE student photo contest



1. Tell us about yourself:-

I am an IT developer by profession but a Wildlife enthusiast by passion. Whenever I get time, I always try to explore the different dimensions of our Mother Nature and try to share the same with others as well.

2. Why did you become a photographer?

Though I have always been drawn to beautiful photographs, but my own journey started with a very defining moment, the last day of my school. At that day I realised, all moments in my life which

I feel are precious and beautiful should be with me forever. At that instant itself I decided to capture each & every moment that I feel has a story to tell.

3. Do you remember your first click?

Yes,it was in the year 2010, when I just purchased my first prosumer camera (Nikon L810) and took the pic of a Peacock Pansy butterfly which was sitting on my room's window pane.

4. What were your initial gears? And what is your current go-to choice?

My initial gear was a Nikon prosumer digital camera (Nikon L810). Currently I am using Nikon D7200 & Nikon D5600 along with Tamron 150-600mm(My primary lens), Nikon 70-300mm & other wide angle lenses.

5. How do you balance life & photography?

I work in an IT field & sometimes it becomes really tough to take out proper time required for wildlife photography(As time is one of the key factors),but I always try to schedule my trips at least 5-6 months prior to the the scheduled date and keep my gears always ready.



6. Tell us about this Photograph (the one won in the contest), What's the story behind this?

Before the dawn was about to set in, I took the help of thickly populated bushes to make it a camouflage hiding place for myself in order to photograph the avian beauties or mammals. And after several hours of waiting, to my surprise this feline just passed few feets away, in front of my eyes and gifted me with a handful of memorable photographs.
