moody monsoon


Photo Contest

His Saba in a small village Suddenly it was raining and he was playing with the muddy water of the rain.





Divulge the mysteries of nature

Social Animal Red Weaver Ants

Red Weaver Ants are social insects of the family Formicidae (order Hymenoptera). They live in trees or bamboos and are known for their unique nest building behavior, where workers construct nests by weaving together leaves using larval silk. Colonies can be extremely large consisting of more than a hundred nests spanning numerous trees. The skin color of these weaver ants varies with the species and range from red to yellow- brown.

Red Weaver ant colonies are founded by one or more mated females (Queens). A Queen lays her first clutch of eggs on a leaf and protects and feeds the larvae until they develop into mature workers. The workers then construct leaf nests and help rear new brood laid by the Queen. The new nests are constructed in



tandem with the increased ant population. As the number of workers increases, more nests are constructed, and colony productivity and growth increase significantly. Workers perform tasks that are essential to colony survival, including foraging, nest construction, and colony defense. The exchange of information and modulation of worker behavior that occur during worker-worker interactions are facilitated by the use of chemical and tactile communication signals. Tactile communication includes signals that include body shaking, stimulate activity and attenuation in receiving signals.

The modulation, interaction and exchange of messages of weaver ant workers are conducted by their signals. These signals are used primarily in the contexts of foraging and colony defense. Successful foragers lay down pheromone trails that help recruit other workers to new food sources. Pheromone trails are also used by patrollers to recruit workers against territorial intruders. Workers exhibit social carrying behavior as part of the recruitment process, in which one worker will carry another worker in its mandibles and transport it to a location requiring attention.



The responsibilities of weaver ants are divided according to their size. Most of the worker ants defend, search for food, expand and maintain their colony. The minor ants stay in their nest and look after the eggs and offspring's. The scale insects near to their nest and milk them for honeydew.

I have worked for sometime to understand the behaviors of the Red Weaver Ants, their lives and tried to record them through my photos. Some of the behaviors of Red Weaver Ants are shown here with appropriate images to understand.

Do you remember your first click?

What were your initial gears? And what is your current go-to choice?

I have bought Nikon d7100 DSLR camera. But still now I using it. At present, I feel need a Nikon 24-70 mm lens. As well as, my current choice is a drone camera. One or two years later, hopefully I can buy it.

How do you balance life & photography?

It's very easy for me to balance my life and photography. I spend one or two days per week for photography. Tell us about this Photograph (the one won in the contest), What's the story behind this?

Pottery or clay pots making is a traditional profession in Bangladesh. Day by day this profession and professional people are decreasing. When I taught with them, they told me that at present modern people don't want to use clay pots. People are interested to using ceramics and glass pots.

But our history and tradition are related with it. One of the big reason to taking the photo is one day this pottery will be lost. I want to archive the history and moment. Because, every photo bear history. So I wanted to taking the photo with artistic and as well as different angle.

When I was taken this photo, the pottery maker was busy in drying the pots in sunlight. I have taken this photo at a village near Gaibandha district in Bangladesh.
